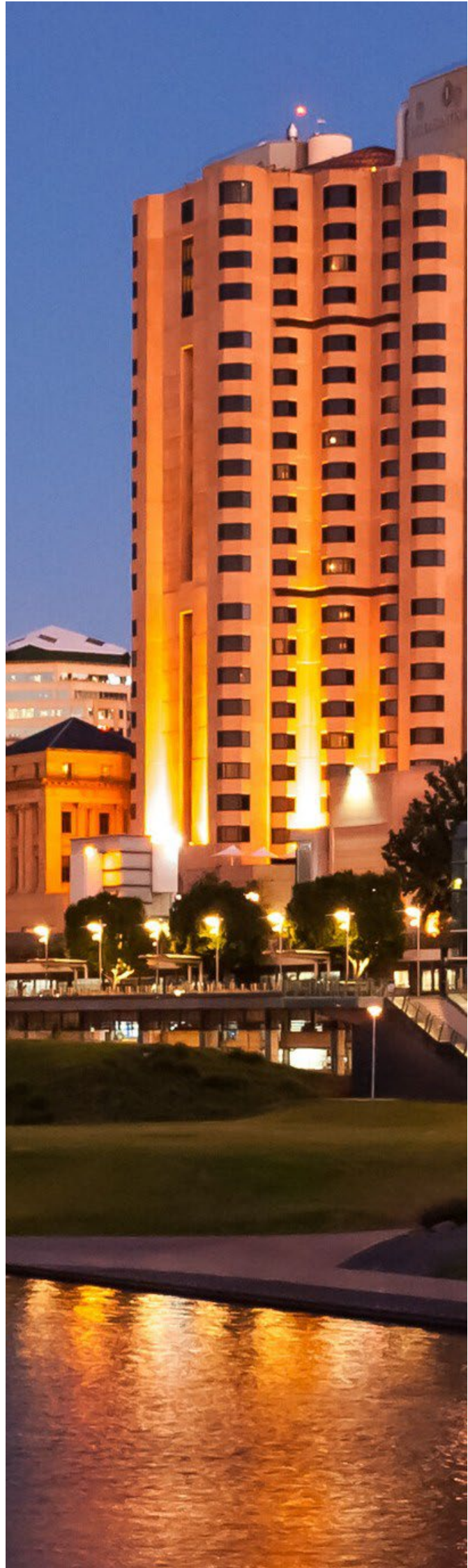

We are proud to have the strong support of our sponsors and partners and the enthusiastic participation of diverse communities. Together we can begin this vital conversation.



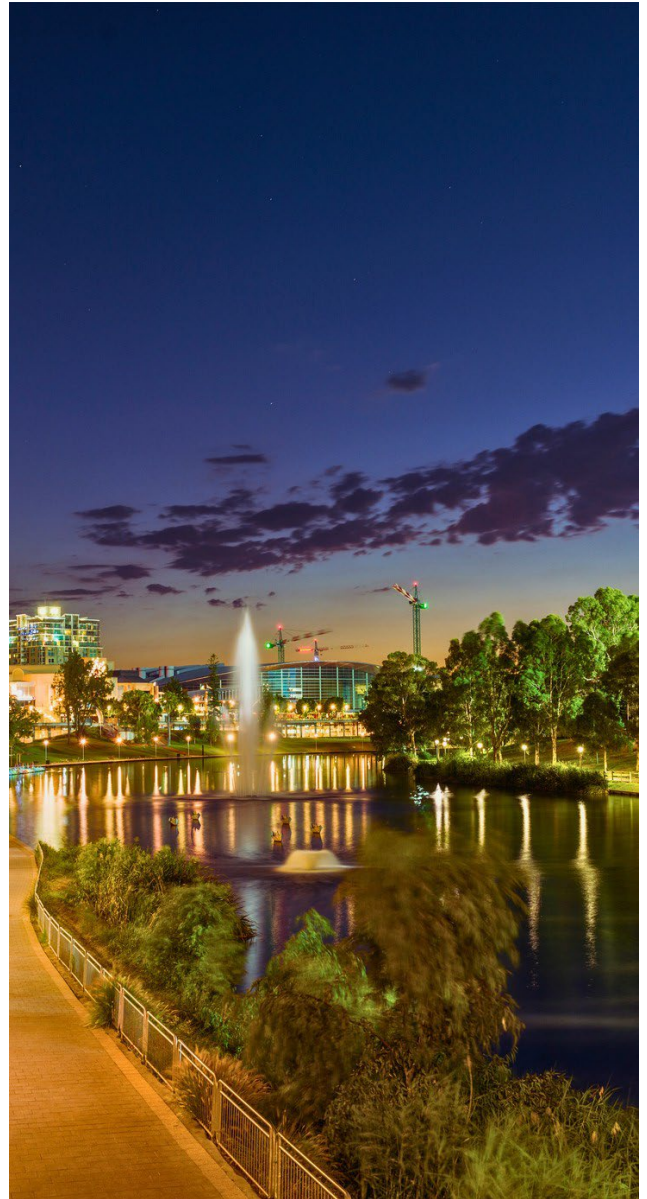
